




What is sustainable development?

(Brundtland Report, 1987)







Open the conversation!

What is already done, what could be done in different aspects of your organisation?

With a short and easy questionnaire, you can easily gather answers to these in one place

Workshop the answers together

Go through the different answers – working together there are probably more ideas that come up

Set goals

Set one realistic goal per sector in your association

Doing a little is miles better than not developing your activities at all!

Follow the progress regularly

Are goals met? At what 'cost'? Should you set new goals?

You can for instance follow the progress by having a sustainability responsible per sector, or if your association is small, among the board

We calculate our emissions for this year and in the future


About tracking the progress
